What is a PFD? - Discussion

Materials

- PFD (Personal Flotation Device)
- Photo of a PFD, if real item not available (attached)

Directions

- Sit the joey scouts down ready for a discussion, have the PFD or photo somewhere out of sight.
- Talk to the children about your upcoming trip to Brownsea and some important things they will need to know to stay safe.
- Tell the children they will need to use a PFD, ask them what they think the letters might stand for (it can be fun to get some silly answers, so try to choose joeys who won't know the answers first)
- Show the joeys the PFD let them have another guess at what the letters might stand for.
- Explain what each word means
 - Personal only for you, 2 or 3 people can't share the same PFD
 - Flotation helps you to float keeps your head above water
 - Device A thing made to do a special job
- Explain to the children why we wear a PFD at Brownsea and remind them they must wear it at all times near or in the water.

What's in the suitcase? - Activity

Materials

- Suitcase/bag
- Most appropriate boating clothes eg: long sleeve & collared shirt, long & breathable pants, wide brimmed hat, enclosed shoes/water shoes, sunscreen.
- Appropriate boating clothes eg: polo shirt, knee length & breathable shorts,
- Non-sunsafe clothes swimmers/singlet top, short shorts, cap
- Non-breathable clothes long jeans
- Unsafe clothes thongs/sandals
- Print outs of categories for appropriate boating clothes. (attached)

Directions

- Before starting the activity place all the clothing in the suitcase or bag and lay the category print outs on the floor (or write the words on a whiteboard/chalk on the floor)
- Discuss the 4 categories for appropriate boating clothing with the joey scouts.
 - Breathability clothes that allow air to come through and keep you cool, also dry quickly.
 - o Sun safe clothing and accessories that cover up your skin and stops sun burn.
 - Comfortable clothing that allows for movement and is comfortable to sit in for long times.
 - o Safe Clothing that is not dangerous including shoes that will protect your feet.
- Ask the joey scouts to look in the suitcase and pull out an item (this can be done one at a time or with all joeys choosing an item at once). Give each joey a chance to explain what their item is and discuss as a group if it is appropriate for boating or not.
- Discuss with the Joey scouts what they have at home that would be appropriate to wear for their upcoming trip to Brownsea.

Activity Alternatives

- Instead of packing a suitcase, have leaders/parent helpers dress in different clothing, some being appropriate for boating and some not. Have a discussion with the Joey scouts about the different outfits and why they are/aren't appropriate.
